Parent Questionnaire

<u>Lateral Flow Tests</u> <u>Secondary and Post 16 Only</u>

Please note that if your child is taking part in the Lateral Flow test they do <u>not</u> need to test during the Easter Break. Your child should start testing again on Sunday night 18th April or Monday morning 19th April.

During term time tests should be taken twice a week in the morning before attending school. Each test should be 3-5 days apart. We suggest Monday and Thursday Mornings of each week.

All Results should be reported to covid@uffculme.bham.sch.uk

If your child tests positive on a Lateral Flow device, you will need to inform NHS Test and Trace, www.gov.uk/report-covid19-result and also inform school by emailing your Lateral Flow Test results to: covid@uffculme.bham.sch.uk

Your child will then need to take a Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR test). Tests can be booked by telephoning 119 or visiting:

https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test. If this test returns as positive, your child and household must remain in the home for ten days.


