What Have We Been Up To?



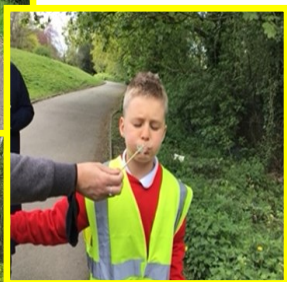

Over the Summer term 3/4/5/B have been going for walks in Highbury Park. We loved going out and exploring especially blowing the dandelions.



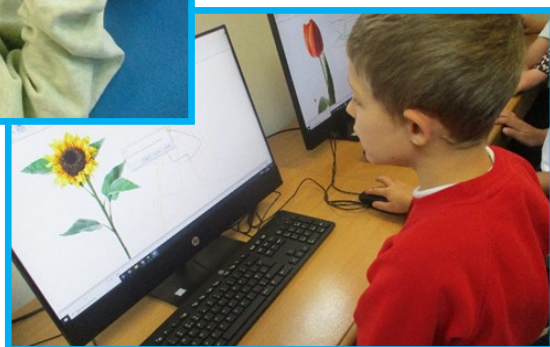
3/4G have loved going to Forest School every week, having time to explore outdoors, learn new skills and taking part in different activities. Making a bug hotel was one of our favourite things!

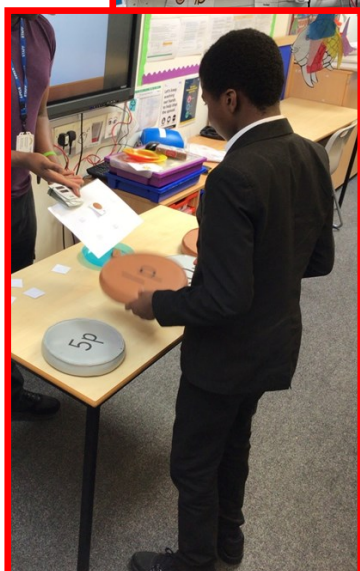
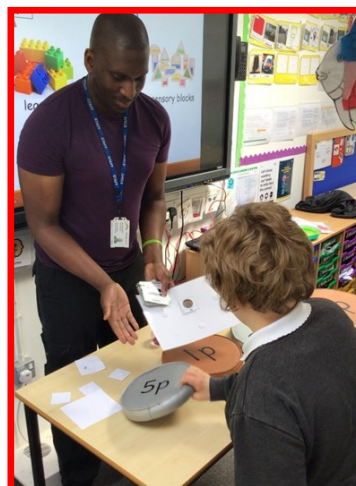
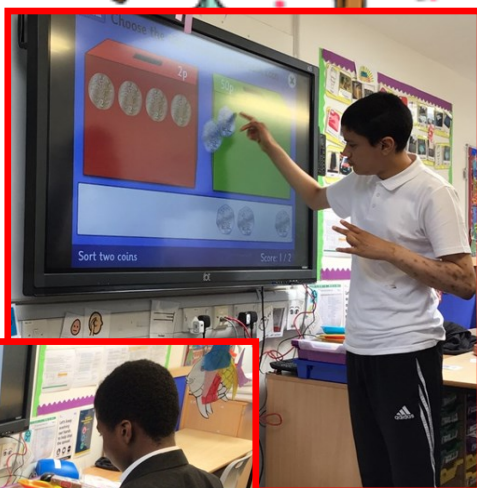


5/6O

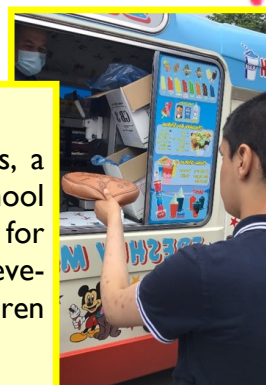

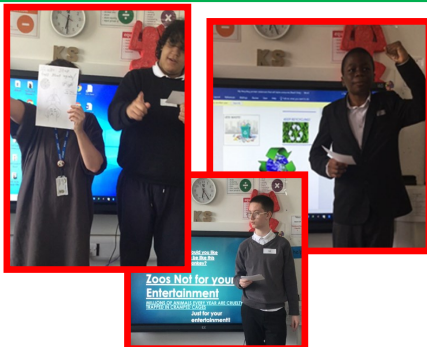
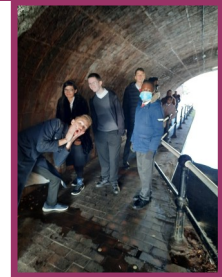

Parent/Carer Information

School Meals

When your child first starts at Uffculme School, we ask what their meal booking pattern will be. Over time, your child's requirements may change. If you would like to change your child's meal booking pattern please email enquiry@uffculme.bham.sch.uk and include the following information:

- Your child's name
- The new meal booking pattern for each day
- The date you would like this to start from (please allow 24 hours' notice for any changes)

All payments for school meals must be made on ParentPay **in advance**. If you require any support with ParentPay or require your activation details, please contact the school office.


If your child may be eligible for free school meals you can complete an online check: <https://www.cloudforedu.org.uk/ofsm/birmingham>. You will receive an instant decision and the school will also be notified of the outcome by email. You only need to apply once, if your eligibility changes since the initial application school will be notified automatically.

Children in reception class that are of compulsory school age, until the end of year 2 are currently entitled to universal free school meals. When your child moves into year 3 you will be charged for school meals unless your child is eligible for free school meals or you make any changes to your child's meal booking pattern before then.

Free School Meals for Summer

Birmingham City Council are providing £60 free school meal vouchers for eligible children for the summer period which will be distributed through school. You will receive an email during the week commencing 12th July which will include the Cheque Number and Validation Code to order your eVoucher.



Dear Parent or Carer

If your child is eligible for Home to School Transport, you will receive a letter over the summer with details of your child's individual travel arrangements.

However, in the meantime, I write to let you know details of your school's main Home to School Transport provider from September onwards.

For your school the main transport provider will be National Express Accessible Transport (NEAT).

This provider will cover the majority of pupil journeys for your school. However, as we finalise the arrangements for your child's transport for September, you will be written to confirming their provider, their child's approximate pick up and drop off times and details of their route.

Lateral Flow Tests Secondary and Post 16 Only

We are mindful that with Covid guidance changing and the uncertainty of when restrictions will end, that we need to assume Lateral Flow Tests will be with us still in September.

To prepare for this we'll be sending home a box of Lateral Flow Tests with all students at the end of term. If your child is taking part in the Lateral Flow Test they do not need to test during the Summer break. Your child should start testing again on the Wednesday night or Thursday morning, ready for school on the 6th September.

All results should be reported to covid@uffculme.bham.sch.uk

If your child tests positive on a Lateral Flow device, you will need to inform NHS Test and Trace, www.gov.uk/report-covid19-result and also inform the school by calling 0121 464 9634.

Your child will then need to take a Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR test). Tests can be booked by telephoning 119 or visiting:
<https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test>.

If this test returns as positive, your child and household must isolate in the home for ten days and inform school.

Dear Parents and Carers

The daily programmes will vary depending on the site and location of each local club. Most clubs will run for a minimum of 4 hours a day, Mondays to Fridays.

Home to School Transport

Dear Parent or Carer

We write with further information on 'Home to School' transport to keep you up to date and let you know what you can expect from our service during the summer. The government are signalling an end to all COVID restrictions at the moment. When term resumes in September we will be returning to pre-COVID travel arrangements, so there will no longer be bubble arrangements for home to school transport. This means that passenger numbers on each vehicle will be governed by journey times and pupil needs.

We will continue to carefully follow health and safety protocols, including increased cleaning regimes on vehicles and transport staff may choose to continue to wear face coverings (drivers are not required to wear them whilst driving). We ask that pupils wash their hands with soap and water, or hand sanitiser prior to boarding. In addition, if your child has any [symptoms](#) of COVID-19 or has been required to isolate, they must not travel.

Extra cover for routes

The Council's contractors already build in contingency to cover staff sickness and vehicle breakdown. In addition, the Council is also securing a small amount of additional contingency transport capacity as requested by the Department for Education, to cover any additional transport which may be needed. In effect, from September, we are able to call on alternative providers to quickly cover for any problems, we minimise any disruption to families, passengers and schools.

Families will also be aware that the **Clean Air Zone** went live on 1st June. Families should be aware that September sees increased traffic volumes and this along with new routes people take outside the clean air zone may mean journey times take a few weeks to settle at the start of the year. This is quite normal and could be more so as some people return to offices for the first time.

Generally, these routes settle in the first few weeks of term and will ultimately lead to quicker journey times.



What happens next?

We (either the Council or the transport operator) will be in regular touch over the coming weeks to let you know:

- Your operator details
- Your guide details
- Your route details
- Your drop off and pick up times
- Details of your meet and greet session

We would be very grateful if you would wait for us to contact you rather than contacting us.

Please also let us know of any **changes to your circumstances** so that we can adjust your arrangements as necessary.

The Home to School transport operation is very complex and details of **routes and services may change** over the summer; however, we will let you know about any changes as soon as they occur. Thank you in advance for your patience.

We are pleased to say that currently our transport is running 99.6% of all its routes on time, and we are determined to build on this improvement.

Parents and carers are also politely reminded that they need to bring their child to the agreed pick up point in the mornings.

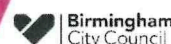

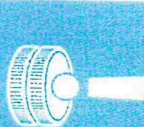
