The October Big Draw Festival is an annual celebration of the power of drawing, and hundreds of schools from all over the world take part. For many students, drawing is a means of understanding the world, how it looks, and how it works. There is increasing evidence to suggest that drawing is the single most powerful tool for learning and retaining new ideas.

Primary sticker collection for ALDI'S Kit For Schools


The last date to collect stickers is **Sunday 3rd November**.
